Presentation #1: Student Choice Initiative Update

Presented By: Melissa Cusack-Striepe

DISCUSSION:

- Student choice initiative reflected on the website
- it's going to be mentioned throughout SAGM
- SCI is a change to make some non-essential fees OPTIONAL
- 10% tuition cut for students, less money for the university
- Changes to OSAP
 - Amount of money for grants and loans reduced.
 - Interest grace period was eliminated.
- MES FEE is no longer mandatory
 - Most relevant to the MES
- Some fees are still considered mandatory



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- We responded by:
 - advocating for the mandatory portion of the MES fee
 - academic and wellness fee
 - everyone still takes advantage of these services.
 - Membership structure for those who opted in
 - Benefits to people who have paid those fees.
 - Logistical changes to events and plans
 - Created a tiered budget based on income.
 - Looked for sponsorship
 - Campaigned about the value of the MES.
- ECCS FEE: 45
- Academic and wellness: 1.15
- 49.75 non mandatory fee + 6.47 in tax
 - The tax is due to the fact that the fee is not associated with the university
 - By creating a membership you have to add tax by law.
- Maclab endowment fund: 50
- Hatch Construction Fee: 50 (mandatory)
- Included in Membership
 - Positions of involvement (mes council, welcome week, drain volunteers)
 - Preferred pricing and early purchase for MES events
 - preferential funding for clubs and teams with a high percentage of MES members
 - MES equipment rental
 - closed conference attendance
 - MEC deposit
 - - Does not include:
 - Bus monitoring
 - MES Committees.
- Isn't the MES a non-profit? (tax)
 - this has to do with the fee itself
 - Any compulsory fee that goes along with tuition is not taxable, but now that it isnt, a tax needs to be applied.
 - The fee is now just a general transaction
 - And because the membership provides enough value, a tax must be applied
 - does not have to do with being a non profit
- Can the MES register as a non profit?
 - This can be discussed further in another setting, but we have looked into it slightly.
- How is a club team or society supposed to distinguish between members?
 - You will have to provide the MES with a list of student numbers, which will be run through a system that checks whether or not the given student number has paid their fee.
- We will be having several motions related to membership
 - these changes will need to continue as they present themselves.
- We will have a way for checking membership at the drain (anonymously)
- Will be having a town hall, and MES SCI committee and feedback to central campus as a means of advocacy
- Working on strategies to increase student membership.
- In the past, the fee was waived for coop students? What now?
 - If you want to be an mes member, you have to pay your fee, coop students will be required to purchase membership, otherwise they are not a member
- How do coop members get to the drain if they are closed after hours?
 - email Ian
- What is the fastest way to validate membership
 - As long as you didnt opt out, you are a member, check mosaic
- What's in it for students? What about students with financial need?
 - There are possible exemptions to the fee associated with financial need
 - COOC's will have the ability to exempt people from the fee on the basis of financial need.
 - This does not count as a membership, but it waives the barrier to participation.
- Club funding will be based on overall percentage as well as team needs. Funding will be flexible and decided on a case by case basis. MES membership will just provide a bonus amount.

DISCUSSION:

- Changes made to the constitution with respect to tiered membership
 - Full membership, associate membership and partial membership, info for them can be found in presentation materials.
- Should non MES members be allowed to vote, and if not how would we control that
 - Great question, we are still trying to figure out the best way to go about this.
 - Part of the reason that we wanted to have full representation of those in the faculty of engineering is to make sure that this right is open to everyone and we are here to represent everyone in the faculty, not just members.
- People who purchase their membership on coop would have what kind of membership?
 - full
- Associate membership, can attend sagm but cannot vote at sagm, how will this be enforced?
 - It's a very tough challenge that we do not have the means to fix right now
 - In the situation that we have an associate member, we would know who they are.
- 2/3's vote at council for associate membership
 - It's for students who are not part of the faculty of engineering to become a part of our community.
- Budget surplus was super high a few years back from an excess student fee, it was supposed to go back to capstone. If this happens in this kind of membership system, what would the MES do?
 - It would be put out as a referendum for everyone to vote on.
- Is associate membership going to be advertised, or is this more through word of mouth
 - we can definitely explore advertising this.
- Those who don't have the financial means to pay the fee,
 - the honorary membership is strictly for participation purposes, extra perks of full membership are not included in associate membership
- Can partial membership members have appointed positions
 - No
- What about those who are not paying the fee out of malintent?
 - We still represent them as students in the faculty, so we need to support them even if they do not support the MES.
 - The MES mission statement is to support a well rounded education for all students
- How is the associate membership fee handled in the constitution. In the constitution is there any other membership that requires no payment

**MES Robert's Rules of Order:
Hand Signals Cheat Sheet!**

General Rules:

- Raise your hand if you wish to speak
- You may only speak if recognized by the chair (CRO)
- The chair keeps a running speaker list, so, for the most part, the order in which you put your hand up is the order in which you will speak
- All "quick points" take precedence
- All "direct responses" will speak before the next "new point"
- Try not to repeat points other people have already made



New Point

Do you have something *new* to say that doesn't have anything to do with the current discussion? Use this!



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Direct Response

Do you want to be involved in the current discussion? Do you have a direct response to something that has been said. Is your speaking point *a part* of the current discussion? Use this!



“Quick” Point

Do you have a quick question that will be answered in one sentence?

Ex. Clarification (“what does that abbreviation stand for?”), Informational (“How much was budgeted for that?”), etc.



I Agree

Instead of repeating what someone else said and making the conversation circular, if you agree, simply put a thumbs up.



Circular Motion

(Try to avoid)

Make this hand signal if you think discussion is becoming circular (ie. people are repeating the same thing). If the chair recognizes enough signals, the discussion will be ended.
